



Dear Community Member,

The government has decided that every police force in England and Wales will set up dedicated, visible, accessible and responsive Neighbourhood policing teams to work with the local community to identify and respond to local priorities. In Stockport, this is already well underway.

One of the key aims of the Safer Stockport Partnership this year is to get better at working with the community to understand the things that local people are most worried about, and then act on them.

We want to work together with you to identify the right priorities, involve you in the solutions, and keep you and the wider community informed about what is happening within your area.

One of the major things that every Neighbourhood team will be doing is identifying a network of key contacts. These are people that we think are particularly well placed to understand their community and the latest concerns local people have about crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour.

You have received this letter because we would like you to become part of the Key Individual Network in your local area. This is not a formal position of any kind and you would not be required to attend any fixed meetings. The network is simply a group of 20 people from different walks of life who all have good knowledge of their community. Being part of the network means that you give consent to your local Police Community Support Officer consulting with you on a regular basis to get your views on issues within your area. This will help us to identify new concerns or issues that exist in your community, and see whether what we are currently doing to tackle problems is working or not.

By agreeing to be a key contact in your area, we would like to keep you as a contact for as long as possible. However, there is no obligation to remain on the network and you can withdraw from the process at any time. If you are happy to be part of the Key Individuals Network for _____ Neighbourhood, please complete the relevant details on the attached form.

On behalf of the Safer Stockport Partnership, may I take this opportunity to personally encourage you to get involved. Your help will be invaluable in ensuring we work together to help make Stockport a safer place for everyone to live and work in.
